Guiding Values

- Our mission is to rebalance for population equity, and ensure all voices in our Ward have fair access to all levers of local government
- This is an <u>apolitical</u> task force: our responsibility is to land boundaries
- Task force members will not be current ANC commissioners, or running in 2022
- All meetings will have ASL interpretation and Spanish translation.

Task Force & Meeting Groundings

- All task force members will be actively engaged in this work and expected to take on leadership roles throughout process

What is Redistricting?

- Decennial opportunity to rebalance our populations for representation in local government!
- New Ward boundaries were approved by DC Council in December: No change to Ward 4
- Council subcommittee on redistricting: At-Large Councilmembers Silverman, Bonds, Henderson
- Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (ANCs) are made up of commissioners elected to represent the interests of their Single Member District (SMD).
- Ward 4 has 6-10 SMD commissioners per ANC currently.
- Ward 4 Redistricting Task Force will be updating SMD and ANC boundaries to create a recommendation to the DC Council of Ward 4's ANC & SMD boundaries for decade ahead.
- Task Force will leverage public input to ensure new boundaries best serve community needs
- Report of recommendation due to Council by April 1
- DC Council will hold ANC/SMD boundaries hearing in April; Council can make changes
- Final vote on ANC/SMD boundaries in June.

Description of ANC 4B Boundaries.

Beginning at the intersection of the District of Columbia—State of Maryland boundary and Georgia Avenue, N.W.; Southeast along the District of Columbia—State of Maryland boundary to Kennedy Street, N.E.; West on Kennedy Street, N.E. to South Dakota Avenue, N.E.; Northwest on South Dakota Avenue, N.E. to Riggs Road, N.E.; Southwest on Riggs Road, N.E. to Missouri Avenue, N.W.; Northwest on Missouri Avenue, N.W. to Longfellow Street, N.W.; West on Longfellow Street, N.W. to Shepherd Road, N.W.; Northwest on Shepherd Road, N.W. to 7th Street, N.W.; South on 7th Street, N.W. to Longfellow Street, N.W.; West on Longfellow Street, N.W. to Georgia Avenue, N.W.; North on Georgia Avenue, N.W.; West on Longfellow Street, N.W. to Georgia Avenue, N.W.; North on Georgia Avenue, N.W. to the point of beginning. [July 13, 2012, D.C., Law 19-157, § 2(a)].

Description of SMD 4B01 Boundaries.

All streets are located in the Northwest quadrant. Beginning at the intersection of Georgia Avenue and the District of Columbia—State of Maryland boundary; Southeast along the District of Columbia—State of Maryland boundary to Cedar Street; South and then west on Cedar Street to 6th Street; South on 6th Street to Butternut Street; West on Butternut Street to 8th Street; North on 8th Street to Highland Avenue; West on Highland Avenue to 9th; North on 9th Street to Elder Street; West on Elder Street to Georgia Avenue; North on Georgia Avenue to the point of beginning. [July 13, 2012, D.C. Law 19-157, § 2(a)]


