

21 IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

24 To require that the District of Columbia Public Schools provide transportation to swing space
25 locations that are greater than a 1/2 mile from the school's regular address.

26
27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
28 act may be cited as the "Swing Space Transportation Support Act of 2022".

29 Sec. 2. Swing Space Transportation Support.

30 (a) During the modernization of a District of Columbia Public Schools ("DCPS") school
31 facility, DCPS shall provide free round-trip transportation between the school's permanent
32 campus and the school's swing space campus in the following instances:

33 (1) If the school's swing space is located outside the normal boundaries of the
34 school, or

35 (2) If the school's swing space is located 1/2 mile or greater from the school's
36 permanent address.

37 (b) For purposes of this section, the term “swing space” means a school’s temporary
38 location during a modernization or major capital renovation.

39 Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.

40 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal
41 impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975,
42 approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

43 Sec. 4. Effective date.

44 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
45 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as
46 provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December
47 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of
48 Columbia Register.
