DCPS MAINTENANCE STRATEGY

SCHEDULED MAINTENANCE

- Preventative maintenance initiatives (HVAC, Elevators, Roofing, Fire Alarms, PA & Clocks, Electronic Security)
- Pre-determined service schedules (i.e., mowing, waste collection, etc.)
- Routine systems inspections

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UNSCHEDULED REPAIRS

- Emergency Priority Work Orders
 (immediate threats to buildings, i.e., a
 burst pipe causing flooding)
- High Priority Work Orders (maintenance issues that require expedited attention, i.e., facility-wide HVAC problem)
- Routine Priority Work Orders (typical building repairs that will not impact operations, i.e., replacing a broken light)

MODERNIZATION PROJECTS

- School Modernizations
- Small capital projects (i.e., HVAC system upgrade, new playground, field upgrades, etc.)

HVAC

Conduct Preventative Maintenance and repairs to ensure all schools have cooling available on the first day of classes.

FIRE, LIFE, SAFETY

 Conduct inspections and repairs to Fire Alarms, PA and Clock Systems, and Electronic Security systems.

DCPS IDENTIFIED PRIORITIES

 Complete Work Orders identified by DCPS Central and DCPS Principals for summer completion.

DGS IDENTIFIED PRIORITIES

 Complete Work Orders identified by DGS during summer assessments, summer walkthroughs, or other emerging priorities identified during the summer.

DCPS PROJECTS

 Closely monitor DCPS projects where project delays or failure to complete projects would have a significant impact on the first day of classes.

The goal of summer readiness maintenance is to prevent facility-wide system failures, address known high priority work orders and problem types, and delivery of capital projects on time for a successful first day of classes at DCPS.







Identifies any corrective maintenance needed outside of the work order system to prevent system wide failures or outages.



DCPS HVAC

- The DCPS HVAC PM program cataloged all DCPS HVAC assets into a centralized database.
- These assets are grouped into various mechanical system type zones, and a dedicated HVAC contractor team is assigned to each zone.
- DGS Staff and HVAC contractor resources compose
 a combined force of 135 technicians, engineers, and operators.

DCPS ELEVATORS


- DGS maintains 100+ DCPS elevator assets through both PM services and work order repairs submitted.
- Inspections include monthly service schedules, and annual service inspections.
- Testing includes 5-year load tests.

Door & Lock Work Orders

Work Order priority levels are assigned during intake and are based on the location of the door and the assignment descriptions.

- Exterior doors that are not securing properly, potentially allowing unauthorized access or intrusion.
- The Main Entrance front door is not securing.

 Interior doors that impact daily operations or programming or should be secured for safety reasons.

 An electrical closet or IT closet has a door that is not securing properly.

ROUTINE Repair

 Interior doors that are not securing properly, with minimal risks for intrusion.


 A door that leads to an administrative space such as a Teachers Lounge or an equipment closet is not securing.

DCPS Door and Lock Work Orders submissions are trending down after two years of increases. In FY24, DGS will implement a Door and Lock Preventative Maintenance program targeted at increasing DGS work order response *and* reducing new work orders from being submitted.






DCPS HVAC WATCH LIST





In Summer 2022, DGS developed the DCPS HVAC Watch list to categorize schools across three priority statuses.



DGS developed the HVAC watch list to evaluate the impact of HVAC problems at schools, ranging from minimal and isolated disruptions to facility-wide outages.

While this assessment includes open work order rates, it is primarily calculated from on-site evaluations by HVAC engineers assigned to each DCPS facility conducting system-wide assessments.



Potential for facility-wide and/or major disruptions if no actions are taken



HVAC impacting DCPS programming; Repairs are being closely monitored



- HVAC concerns, if present and being tracked, do not impact more than 5 spaces
- Repairs are being monitored where needed for impacts to instruction

The goal of the HVAC watch list is to closely monitor red and yellow status schools. Green status schools still require HVAC maintenance and repairs, but not in a systemic, facility-wide approach.

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








Monthly Cooling WOs Received

DCPS WO FORECAST & PROGRESS

DGS completed 14% more DCPS work orders than originally projected, including 3,300+ among the Top 10 WO problem types.

Portfolio wide, DCPS work order submissions this summer are 8% more than projected in April 2023. The Top 10 problem type work orders were 69% higher than expected.


In response to more Top 10 problem type work order submissions, **DGS completed** 76% more of these Top 10 work orders than originally forecasted.




